I will overcome this human disease

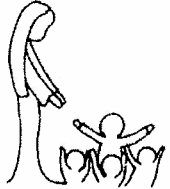
Quiet a screaming mind with open eyes

COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

Only about 8 weeks of classes remain and we'll be at that all important exam week once again. This is the time of the year we call the "grind" and it is more important than ever to remain focused.

Grade 12's - Are you graduating? We would like all the grade 12's and their parents to assist with Grad Decorating from May 6, 7 and 8. Starting Friday night at 5:00. Saturday at 9:00 and Sunday at 1:00 in the gym. It is our intent to have the gym decorating that weekend.

Remember Grad weekend is May 13, 14. Grad mass is May 13 at 7:00pm at Riverfront park weather permitting. Grad ceremonies are at 2:00pm in Glenmary gymnasium.

Make sure that you are fulfilling all grad requirements and that you have 60% of all required correspondence and off-campus programs completed. The final grad list will be posted soon.

Have you been conditionally accepted? Don't forget. "conditionally" means that there are conditions for your acceptance – probably that you pass your courses this semester with specified marks. **Have you received a registration package?** Bring it in and have Mr. Plowman give you a hand if you are having difficulties.

Grade 10's & 11's - Planning for your future? Try your best to develop a career plan early, but if you are not sure what you want to do with your life after Glenmary, just be sure that you are not closing any doors and limiting your options with the courses that you are taking and the marks that you are getting. Mr. Plowman and Mme Randall will be meeting with each of the Grade 10's and the Grade 11's in order to describe the requirements for graduation and discuss certain career options to assist the students with next year's course selection.

Apprenticeships:

An apprenticeship combines theory with hands-on, real life experience. An apprentice's training usually consists of around 10-20% of time spent in the classroom at a tech. school or college and the other 80-90% of the time working under the supervision of a journeyman, essentially an expert in the trade. Unlike academic training, apprentices are paid during their work experience. For most trades, apprenticeships are completed in approximately four years. Upon obtaining journeyman status, graduates are highly employable at above average salaries. Apprenticeships can be applied for at the Human Resources office, or students can start a Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) through school, earning hours toward completion of the

apprenticeship, high school credits, and hourly pay from the employer.

Grade 10 & 11 students will have a chance to explore trades training opportunities at GPRC in Fairview Campus on May 6, 2011. Students will be bussed to the college, where they can learn about the schooling involved in various trade programs offered at NAIT.

Grade 9's - Mr. Plowman & Mme Randall met with the grade 9's and their parents on **May 12 at 7:00 pm** to discuss how Senior High course selection works. Parents who were not able to attend are asked to contact Mr. Plowman or Mme Randall to discuss their child's timetable for next year. Course wish lists are being sent home now for parent signatures to help with timetabling for next year.

Parents of Grade 8 Students

Holy Family Catholic Regional Division schools have chosen to implement a standardized testing program at a variety of grade levels. In late April, grade eight students at Glenmary School will write The Canadian Achievement Tests.

The tests measure achievement in the basic skills generally taught in schools across Canada. The main areas are reading, mathematics, language, writing and spelling. These tests are a good measure of the actual skill level of the students. They do not measure, however, a student's effort or completion on assignments and homework. These are not tests that students can study for, and the results will NOT be counted toward a school mark.

This is part of the school program of identifying skill levels of students. The information from the test results is used to assist the understanding of a student's cognitive ability in relation to growth in basic skills and content areas, as well as assisting in individual student programming.

When the results are available in early fall, you will certainly have the opportunity to discuss the results with the educational staff at Glenmary. If you wish further information or wish to discuss these standardized tests for your son or daughter, please contact me at the school, and I would be happy to meet with you.

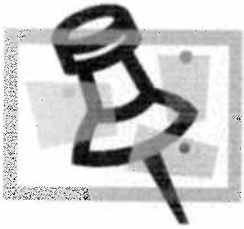

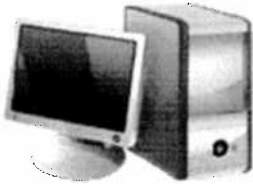

SCHOOL BUS REMINDERS

Eligible Students (more than 2.4 kms from their designated school): If your child is eligible and requires transportation, please register early. If your child currently rides a bus they will be automatically registered for the upcoming year.

Bus Pass Students (within 2.4 km radius of their designated school): You may register early and purchase a bus pass at Peace River Transportation Office anytime throughout the year. EE Oliver School in Fairview, Manning Elementary, Kennedy Elementary in Grimshaw, Menno Simons School and Lloyd Garrison School in Berwyn will be open for bus pass sales the week before school begins. VISA and Mastercard are accepted over the telephone.

School of Choice Students: Transportation approval to school of choice may expire annually, please refer to your letter of approval and apply online if necessary. Students must be approved before they may be registered to ride the school bus. *School of choice procedures are currently under board review and may undergo changes for September.*

Interschool Students: All interschool students must register annually. Interschool spaces are limited and registrations are accepted on a first come first served basis. Register early to ensure seat availability.

New Students and Siblings: Students must be registered before they will be permitted to ride the school bus.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE & ADDICTION

Teens may start using and experimenting with illegal and legal substances for a variety of reasons such as curiosity, peer pressure, unhappy home life, boredom, isolation, stress, or a lack of self confidence. Many of the signs of drug use or alcohol use – in isolation – may be just normal teen behavior. Mood swings or changes in behavior are a standard part of growing up as teens make the transition from childhood to adulthood. Parents know their teens better than anyone. Trust that you will know when there is a problem and when your teen is not acting like themselves. Here are some warning signs that parents should be aware of:

SIGNS IN THE HOME

- loss of interest in family activities
- disrespect for family rules
- withdrawal from responsibilities
- verbally or physically abusive
- sudden increase or decrease in appetite
- disappearance of valuable items or money
- not coming home on time
- not telling you where they are going
- constant excuses for behavior
- spending a lot of time in their rooms
- lies about activities
- finding the following: cigarette rolling papers, pipes, roach clips, small glass vials, plastic baggies, remnants of drugs (seeds, etc.)

SIGNS AT SCHOOL

- sudden drop in grades
- truancy
- loss of interest in learning
- sleeping in class
- poor work performance
- not doing homework
- defiant of authority

- poor attitude toward sports or other extracurricular activities
- reduced memory and attention span
- not informing you of teacher meetings, open houses, etc.

PHYSICAL AND EMOTIONAL SIGNS

- changes friends
- smell of alcohol or marijuana on breath or body
- unexplainable mood swings and behavior
- negative, argumentative, paranoid or confused, destructive, anxious
- over-reacts to criticism
- acts rebellious
- sharing few if any of their personal problems
- doesn't seem as happy as they used to be
- overly tired or hyperactive
- drastic weight loss or gain
- unhappy and depressed
- cheats, steals
- always needs money, or has excessive amounts of money
- sloppiness in appearance

TIPS FOR PARENTS

Here is what you can do to ensure your teen makes a safe decision:

- ✓ Frequently talk about family expectations and rules about drugs. Clearly state and enforce the consequences for breaking the rules. Set clear boundaries.
- ✓ Encourage your teen to take part in community activities or after-school programs, or to get a part-time job.
- ✓ Get to know your teen's friends. Know where they hang out and what they are doing.
- ✓ Talk with your teen about ways to handle peer pressure. Teach your teen how to say "no" and suggest they do something different.
- ✓ Get involved in your teen's education. Know what they are doing at school. Talk to their teachers.
- ✓ Boost your teen's self-confidence and self-worth. Praise his or her attempts as well as achievements.
- ✓ Encourage your teen to express his or her opinions and feelings in a positive way, for example, talking, writing, or drawing.
- ✓ Talk with and listen to your teen. Show that you are there for your teen when he or she needs you. Accept that everyone makes mistakes.
- ✓ Boost your teen's self-confidence and self-worth. Praise his or her attempts as well as achievements.
- ✓ Help your teen develop a positive body image. Encourage your teen to respect his or her body by avoiding alcohol and other drugs, eating healthy foods, and exercising regularly.
- ✓ *If you suspect your teen is using drugs or has an addiction contact a health professional, your school support worker/counsellor, or your local AHS Addictions and Mental Health office.

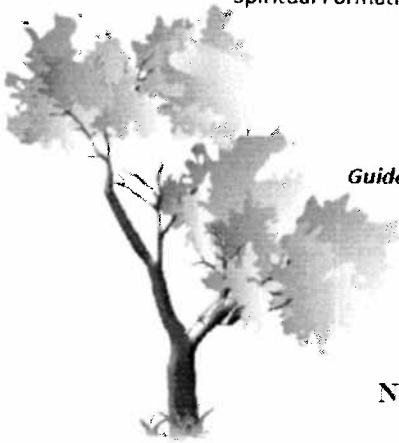
