Holy Family CRD No. 37 has:

- The percentage of students who achieve the acceptable standard on PATS has declined and the percentage who achieve the standard of excellence on PATS has been maintained.
- The percentage of students who achieve the acceptable standard on diploma exams is an issue and the achievement at the excellence level is a concern.
- High school completion rates have increased in the last 3 years.
- Exceptional results of French 30 Diploma Exams in 5 year average.

Holy Family CRD No. 37 priorities:

- Improve acceptable and excellence levels in PATS.
- Improve the effective use of technology to support learning.
- Increase community engagement.
- Increase high school completion rates.
- Improve student success for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students.
- Training Administrators and Instructional leadership teams on the Response to Intervention Framework.

- During the past year Holy Family has held public consultations in the Town of McLennan to come up with strategies to increase student enrolment at École Providence.
- The Board engaged in lobbying the government for a replacement school for Holy Family in Grimshaw and made headline news in its effort to provide students with a functional school facility. The Minister of Education toured the school in January 2012.

- HFCRD's \$23M budget, 76% is allocated to salaries/benefits, 17% to services/contracts/supplies, and 7% to capital/debt services. These figures are reflective of HFCRD's commitment to providing small class sizes and safe, caring learning environments for all students. In the last 5 years, École Providence School has been modernized, Glenmary School and Good Shepherd School added modernized portables, and a new St. Stephen's School was built in 2006.
